

FEBRUARY 2022 WOODLAWN PARK VIRTUAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING (Revised)

The Woodlawn Park City Council meeting met virtually on Monday, February 21, 2022. Present were: Mayor Larry Lewis, Council Members: Mike Brown, Greg Claypool, George Langford, Tom Nunn, Ed Purcell, and Doug Watson. Also in attendance, were Chief Mike Koenig, Gloria Curran, Pat Merrick, and Attorney Matt Carey.

Mayor Larry Lewis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a roll call of Council Members.

The Council reviewed the minutes for the January 2022 meeting. George Langford made a motion to accept the minutes and Tom Nunn seconded the motion. All voted aye and the minutes were accepted.
