JULY 2022 WOODLAWN PARK CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The Woodlawn Park City Council met in person on Monday July 18, 2022. Present were Mayor Larry Lewis, Council Members: Nancye Claypool, George Langford, Tom Nunn, Ed Purcell, and Doug Watson. Also in attendance were: Charlie Vienna, Pat Merrick and Attorney Matt Carey. Mike Brown and Police Chief Mike Koenig were absent.

Mayor Larry Lewis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a roll call of Council Members.

The Council reviewed the Minutes for June 2022. Tom Nunn made a motion to accept the minutes and Doug Watson seconded the motion. All voted aye and the minutes were accepted.

The Council reviewed the Treasurer's Report for June 2022. George Langford made a motion to accept the report and Tom Nunn seconded the motion. All voted aye and the report was accepted.

Pat Merrick had nothing new to report.

Resident's Comments: Independent candidate, Chris Thieneman, stopped by to introduce himself. He is running for Metro City Council in the 7th District.

Old Business: Hall Contracting was in Woodlawn Park milling and paving the streets. Asphalt Oil has gone up \$23,000 since the bid was out. Green Meadow Court will not be paved.

New Business: Tom Nunn made a motion to read City Ordinance No. 3, Series 2022-2023. An ordinance approving the use of American Rescue Plan Act funds for road maintenance and police salary increase. Pat Merrick read the Ordinance.

Mayor's Report

The Mayor reported that Jefferson County is in the Yellow Zone for Covid. Mask wearing is optional. 40207 has the second lowest group in the area.

The City has contacted L G & E regarding the street light on Ambridge Circle. The property owner will have to pay to have it moved.

There will be another meeting about the Thieneman Property on Westport Road at the Eline Library on Wednesday, July 20, 2022. All are invited to attend.

The city has received a check for \$9,900 for Ordinance Codification. The Mayor is moving forward with this project.

During the Heat Advisories, Chief Koenig has suspended giving citations for tall grass.

Council Focus

City Hall: New Council person Nancye Claypool was welcomed. She gave an update on the Little Library.

Infrastructure: Tom Nunn has met with a concrete company to repair the sidewalk at 4250 Darbrook and another project on Orchid Hill. A-1 Concrete gave a price of \$600 to repair Darbrook Road and \$1,800 to repair Orchid Hill for a total of \$2,400.

New Moves and Rentals: Doug Watson reported there were 3 properties sold: 4310 Darbrook Road on July 8, 2022, 903 Perryman Road on July 12, 2022, and 4253 Westport Terrace on July 13, 2022. There is only one other house for sale in the city.

Fence and Building Permits: Mike Brown issued Permit # 183 to Haley Spalding at 6806 Green Meadow Circle for a gate and Permit #184 was issued to Myron Bimonte at 4408 Kinloch Road for a fence addition in the rear yard.

Drainage: George Langford received a call about debris blocking the detention basin behind his home on Stivers on July 6th. On July 7th, District 7 council person McRaney was called about debris on the train tracks. They were going to contact CSX railroad. On July 11, someone on Orchid Place called about standing water on their property.

Community Activities: Ed Purcell reported about 40-50 people attended the Fourth of July Parade. He is also working on the Good Neighbor Awards. He also asked the council for bios for the newsletter.

Tom Nunn made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Nancye Claypool seconded the motion. All voted aye and the meeting adjourned at 7:39 p.m.
